Compulsory REVISION comments	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Abstract should not contain "Discussion" section. Please remove it. 2. Ethical consideration is not explained. We don't know whether consent was taken or not from the patient? 3. Draw tables for blood examinations and CSF analysis. 4. You have written in most of the blood examinations that they were within normal limits. This is not enough. You have to show the result of each blood or CSF analysis. Better show them in a table. 5. References are needed in many sentences (e.g., line 37-39, 43-44, 53-54, 121-123 etc.). In some cases, the whole paragraph contains only one reference (e.g., 181-123, 137-145 etc.). Please give proper references in those areas. 6. Line 65-66: "On examination, he was febrile with stable vitals". Please put the temperature record along with the values of vital signs. 7. Please put the measurement method in laboratory exams (e.g., in line 87, protein 159, CSF Glucose 38.8, CSF ADA 2.5...). We don't know whether the glucose 38.8 was mg/dl, mmol/l etc.). Correct it in all other parts of the case report. 	
Minor REVISION comments	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. English language and grammar mistakes are present in the case report. I have mentioned some as comments. Please review this case report by a native English speaker for corrections. 2. Avoid using long sentences (like in line 62-65). Rather change it into small sentences for better understanding. 3. Abbreviations should be explained on first use, e.g., ADA in line 87. Do it in all other parts? 4. Use the names and dosage of the drugs used. e.g., "he was started on Prokinetics and muscle relaxants" in lines 85-86 or "Inj acyclovir, ceftriaxone and steroids" in lines 90-91. We don't know which drug was used and what was the dose?
