<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	<p>The data is interesting, but the manuscript needs a lot of work before it should be presented.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Please consult an English language editor. There are numerous typos and grammatical errors throughout the manuscript, beginning with the title. The organization and flow of the text presented in the Results and Discussion should mirror the data presented.</li> <li>2. All data are presented as tables. Tables 1 a &amp; b and 2 a &amp; b would be much easier to interpret in a graphical format.</li> <li>3. Please provide a discussion of the seasonal data presented in Table 4, or remove this data.</li> <li>4. Discussion: The authors state that the increasing rate of DRF in men as compared to women is explained by the fact that men are more likely to work outside the home than women. This would appear to explain a higher incidence in men than women, but not an increasing rate of fractures in men. Please explain. The findings from the study appear to indicate that male bone quality is decreasing at an increasing rate, or perhaps women are becoming decreasingly likely to seek medical treatment for a fracture.</li> </ol>
