Minor REVISION comments	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The manuscript is overall clear and writing is adequate. However, I think that authors should perform an additional and careful language and grammar review of the manuscript, since several mistakes are found throughout the text. I recommend, if possible, a professional grammar review for the final improvement of the paper, since this a very important component of writing a scientific article. 2. It would be important to communicate with the readers what we have known about COVID-19 associated mucormycosis (CAM) up until now and what is the major gap of knowledge in this condition. 3. The authors should use "COVID-19" instead of "Covid -19". 4. I recommend writing it into paragraphs rather than writing in bullets with informal language in some of the bullets. 5. It is also essential to describe your case definitions of CAM clearly. 6. It is requested to use the expanded form for all the abbreviations appeared for the first time in the manuscript. 7. Just labelling DM as a risk factor would not be appropriate. They should go into the details of the glucose levels. Is DKA a risk factor? 8. Does smoking and hypertension considered a risk factor for mucormycosis? 9. Discuss the effect of steroids more clearly. I recommend the authors to read the paper (Hassan, A.T., Elmoniem, A.E.A., Abdelrady, M.M., Mohamed, M.E., Mokhtar, M.A., Elsherif, A.A., Saied, G.M. and Kasem, S.M., 2021. Challenges in Steroid and Anticoagulant Therapy in Severe COVID-19 Pneumonia: A Prospective Study. <i>Antibiotics</i>, 10(10), p.1214.). I think it will help the authors. 10. Regarding to the higher mortality of the patients with mucormycosis, it could be commented and considered that it may be due not only to the combination of the two diseases (COVID and mucormycosis) but also to the fact that most of the patients could not receive the optimal treatment. with liposomal amphotericin or had to discontinue using liposomal amphotericin.
