<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	This work is more an empirical note on an economic issue than an article. It is very short (less than ten pages). That said, it can be considered as a short article. The substance of this article is interesting and confirms through analysis a rational intuition, in this case the situation of an industrial sector affected more upstream than downstream by the covid-19 crisis. The author uses a VAR model to draw a number of interesting conclusions about the impact of covid-19 at different stages of the economic process in the household appliances industry, from production to final consumption. Recommendations are proposed to improve the situation of the sector inside and outside the sector. These suggestions are rather general but relevant (external tariff policy and domestic price control). In the end, we welcome the publication of this empirical paper.	
<b>Minor</b> REVISION comments	The plan of this work is not apparent but curiously elements of the plan suddenly appear in the middle of the article (Empirical Test : ... <u>A.</u> Unit Root Test ... <u>B.</u> Johansen Cointegration Test ... <u>C.</u> Granger Causality ..., etc). This casualness in writing is quite common among authors and calls for an effort of rigour in the form of their text without forgetting the necessary transitions between the different subdivisions of the plan. Thus, in this short article, on page 2, there is no transition between Data Source and Model Construction and Construction and Acquisition of POI. Thus, as you read, you discover the concrete content of the "Data Source and Model Construction : " part. This type of asperity can eventually be corrected.
