I suggest that the title be rewritten, as the title displayed: "Association between iron deficiency and other trace elements in childhood febrile seizure" It does not match the results found. Therefore, I suggest, as a title: Analysis of the association between iron deficiency and other oligoelements as a risk factor for childhood febrile seizures.</p> <p>3. The presented objective is not configured as an objective for this study. I suggest rewriting what the purpose of this study actually is.</p> <p>4. Despite being a text presented within the standards of a scientific work, I suggest being clearer about the justification, objectives and methodology.</p> <p>5. No, the text lacks scientific data that could support the study presented, so that in fact scientific efforts are necessary to carry out a study with this theme.</p> <p>6. It is understood that some scientific data, for various reasons, may not be found in an up-to-date manner. However, this study despite reporting some previous studies, these are prior to the last 5 years. In this sense, it is suggested that studies published at least in the last 5 years be used in relation to the study proposed here, so that the findings of this study are better scientifically grounded and confronted with others on the same subject.</p>
