

Editor's Comment:

Although the authors have tried to address the reviewers' suggestions, the revised version of the manuscript **cannot yet be accepted for publication** in the journal. In my opinion, the manuscript should be sent back to the authors for a comprehensive revision before it can be considered again for publication in the journal.

Main reason

This study appears to be very old. The most modern bibliographic reference that appears in it dates back to 2012, ten years ago! Authors should use more up-to-date references. The information provided on dengue in Punjab is very old (year 2011). The study must be updated to the current time.

Other considerations

According to the journal's guidelines, references must be listed at the end of the manuscript and numbered in the order that they appear in the text. Every reference referred to in the text must also be present in the reference list and vice versa. In the text, citations should be indicated by the reference number in square brackets [3], not as superscripts.

Please, use italics to cite the mosquito's species.

Abbreviations and acronyms should be explained the first time they are used in the text.

To make text understanding easier, if the author's name appears in the text, place the reference number immediately after the name, not at the end of the sentence or paragraph.

Please specify the date on which the survey was conducted

Please refer to the figures with their number in the text.

The reference format does not match the journal's reference format. There are different reference formats and numerous errors (incomplete or misquoted references, etc.). References should be checked carefully to transcribe them accurately. Please, consider following the instructions for the authors and the reference examples at the following link:
