<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	The case of carcinoma of the stomach, in addition to the malignancy and the advanced stage described, does not allow us to accurately discern the effect of the bacterial infection. So, the finding would not only involve Brucella sp, but many opportunistic bacteria. y Unfortunately, the origin could have been the food consumed by this immunocompromised patient due to his poor physical and physiological condition. When testing positivity of bacteraemia for brucellosis, and the stage of evolution of the cancer in the case described, it is worth adding the CFU data of the microorganisms, since it is the central issue, and although there is confusion of symptoms, it should be noted that only cultures are the test that proves bacteraemia for these cases.	
<b>Minor</b> REVISION comments	In addition to the carcinoma condition, and from the description of the case I should point out that it appears to be a home-acquired bacteraemia and not hospital-acquired, which is why the most likely source is the consumption of unpasteurized or home-produced dairy products, it seems to me that I should support this information since this condition is very frequent in regions of India and Africa.
