<b>Minor</b> REVISION comments	Paper is technically sound and the grammatical expression of commendable standard, but appears structurally deficient. It has no problem statement, no stated objectives and no theoretical framework, not even conclusion and recommendations. That makes it more journalistic than academic. Based on the structural prescriptions of the journal the paper is recommended for publication after being restructured and the changes reflected in the abstract. The historical background to the conflict as the paper limits it to 1994 appears to be inadequate. The Western role in creating and benefitting from the conflict would have provided a richer background.
