Minor REVISION comments	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Title: Your study is a case report. Your title is confusing and makes it difficult for the reader to determine the focus of the paper. Do not try to make your title sound "original"; instead make it as clear and comprehensive as possible. The title should express the focus and sometimes the context of your case. Think about your main message and try to align your title with it. You should include the sentence "a case report" in the title, so that a reader knows what kind of study you have conducted. ❖ Abstract: Write the abstract with 350 words in maximum. The abstract should include the same four sections as the main text in a succinct form (introduction and objective, case presentation, discussion and conclusion). I suggest you to answer the following question in order to make your abstract more attractive and informative: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ What is the main subject of your report? ✓ Who is your target audience and what do they need to know? ✓ Who is the patient? ✓ What are his/her main clinical manifestations? Briefly describe case management and outcome. ✓ What has this case taught you? ✓ What is the take-home message for the reader? ❖ Introduction: The introduction is not enough informative. What is special about the disease entity or illness you are describing? What was challenging about the case: diagnosis, management, complications or treatment side effects...?Do not go into detail in the introduction but give the reader a clear idea of which aspects of case management you will be describing. ❖ Case report: Good. You have well narrate your case in a way that is easy and enjoyable to follow. However, I suggest you to bring back the figure from the end of the paper to their respective paragraphs from this section. In order to make the reading easier for the reader and also to keep the reader engaged. ❖ Discussion: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Try to well explain why your particular case is important, and of interest to the reader? ✓ Try to well sum up the current literature related to your case. Describe what has already been reported about your topic, and what the main hypotheses and theories are that explain the clinical findings. Remember that reviewers look for evidence that your case is rare. ✓ Try to state in the take-home message for the reader, how your case report affects the future clinical practice? ❖ Conclusion: No problem.
