Traditional standardized fermentation process needs to be described 3. Nutritional information (Alcohol content, acid content) of the final product Arak Bali needs revision (So that it can able to categorize whether the drink falls under Class A, Class B or Class C) 4. Permissible limit of alcohol content in the Traditional fermented drink needs to be included according to Indonesia/Bali Law.

Optional/General comments	<p><i>Arak Bali</i> is one of the traditional Balinese alcoholic drinks, it is used for consumption during religious rituals and as traditional medicine. But it was observed that, there is no clear evidence specifically mentioned in the manuscript that <i>Arak</i> was used to treat human ailments. Since, if the alcoholic content in the <i>Arak Bali</i> is 20-55% it will falls under Class C category. The permissible limits for human consumption rate of alcohol is about 30mg/100mL blood beyond this limit it affects central nervous system, liver and in extreme condition lead to liver cirrhosis so that it has a social impact. Since the role of the wine industry in the Bali is to develop traditional village centers and non-centra of the wine industry because the drink <i>Arak Bali</i> is the most prominent economy source (income and community economic empowerment).</p> <p>As part of the culture of society, the existence of alcoholic beverages requires control. The Governor of Bali is the holder of authority for the Balinese people can regulate by controlling the quality of this drink by distillation distillate excess alcohol after fermentation and bring down alcohol content below 10% (so that it will be in Class B category) and can secure human health and development. Supply of the drink to the individual person can be regulated and it can be restricted with minimum numbers since the law has a coercive nature so that the rule of law will provide limitations, prohibitions and permits regarding what is regulated in the law itself.</p>
