Moreover, the discussion should emphasize the unique clinical or educational relevance of the case, drawing attention to any distinctive features, rare presentations, or unexpected outcomes that could broaden our understanding of systemic lupus erythematosus. Finally, the authors should provide a comprehensive review of the current management strategies for SLE, highlighting any novel or experimental therapies that could potentially improve patient outcomes. Incorporating these elements into the article would augment its scientific value and enhance its potential to guide future clinical practice and research.</p>	
<p>Optional/General comments</p>	<p>Systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE) is a disease with multifaceted manifestations, and the cases presented in this study do not offer any novel or distinctive features, lacking innovation. Moreover, while the patients received conventional therapies such as steroids and calcium supplements, no novel biologic agents or small molecule targeted drugs were employed, resulting in a limited clinical significance. Furthermore, the description of the patients' clinical features in the article is inadequate, with essential details such as anti-nuclear antibodies, chest CT scans, brain MRIs, and renal ultrasounds missing. Additionally, the authors stated that the main clinical feature of the patients was a rash, yet they failed to provide sufficient photographic or pathological evidence. In conclusion, this article falls short of scientific standards, and the authors should strive to enhance their clinical expertise and case presentation skills.</p>
