The manuscript is relevant for the scientific community given that it would contribute to the ongoing debate on e-learning, motivation and the digital world in general. 2. Yes, the title suits the article as it relates with the research objectives. Although, I would suggest that the authors reconstruct the second objective of the research to align with the topic. Hence, I suggest: "To explore motivational factors that support or hinder e-learning". 3. The abstract is very comprehensive, but I'll suggest that full meaning of "ESP" mentioned should be given because ESP could mean different things to different people if not explained in this context. 4. The subsections and the structure of the manuscript is alright. The summary of the results from other related journal articles presented on a literature table is perfect. 5. The manuscript is scientifically correct as it reviews several related articles from which conclusions were drawn. However, I would suggest that the authors include the gap the paper intends to cover which will further show how this research differs from all the other related papers reviewed. I have attached one related journal article by Regmi and Jones (2020). 6. Most of the references are current, though it depends on the relevance of the paper. No concern observed. <p>The authors can add these key words to the already outlined: Meta Analysis, Meta-synthesis, e-content.</p> <p>Other comments would be outlined under the general comment.</p>

<p>Optional/General comments</p>	<p>Overall, the article is worth publishing as it would contribute to the ongoing debate on the subject. However, the main part I would suggest the authors to revisit is the methodology. The authors should write in details, how the meta-analysis was applied. For instance, the search strategy, journal selection criteria, inclusion and exclusion criteria, how many journal articles were reviewed in general, how many were selected and why, etc. should be discussed in detail under the methodology.</p> <p>Regmi, K., & Jones, L.
