The manuscript is important for scientific community and the clinical ophthalmologists. The title of the article is suitable The abstract is comprehensive The subsections and structure of the manuscript is appropriate The manuscript is scientifically correct in my opinion The references cited are okay. However, few more key references may be added. For example, <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ling R, Cole M, James C, et al. Suprachoroidal haemorrhage complicating cataract surgery in the UK: epidemiology, clinical features, management, and outcomes. Br J Ophthalmol. 2004;88:4:478-80. Stein JD. Serious adverse events after cataract surgery Curr Opin Ophthalmol. 2012;23:3:219-25. Some of the abbreviations are not mentioned in the text in their 1st instance. For example, Suprachoroidal Hemorrhage (SCH). These should be mentioned in the text It was mentioned by the authors “during surgery, iris prolapse occurred”...what may be the possible reasons for this situation? Was it the possible reason for SCH in the present case? The conclusion of the case study should be based on the clinical findings and results of the present case and should not contain any reference of other workers. Therefore, the conclusion section may be revised and the reference ^[13] may be omitted.
