A good review can reduce it and maintain the quality of the communication, without compromising the information. 4. Yes. despite being extensive, the structure of the article is commendable, needing only a few adjustments. 5. I think so. It needs to be polished a little more, but overall this manuscript has a scientific quality. 6. I have no suggestions for references to add, but I can say that the references in this article are recent and contextualized.

Such as (ZBNF; AF; NF and NBS), are successful examples of sustainable agricultural practices, practiced by ancestors. however, the article broadly addresses various techniques that can and should be adopted to preserve soil fertility, even knowing that such techniques may encounter resistance from local authorities, since they tend not to have the expected yield by farmers.
