My comments are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Introduction: 'If untreated this vascular lesion may lead to cardiac failure, atrial fibrillation and catastrophic embolization': since the expected blood flow direction is from ICA to IJV, what do you mean with '<i>catastrophic embolization</i>' in this situation? Please clarify you statement. - Introduction: 'Asymptomatic or clinically innocuous fistulas between the internal carotid artery and internal jugular vein are very exceptional disorders, not regarded as a common incidentaloma in imaging' In my opinion, such a case is far from being incidentaloma, please revise or delete this sentence. Secondly, clinically 'silent' is a better term than clinically 'innocuous' - Case report: Please do not use trademark names for medical treatment such as 'lasotarn, moduretic and novas'. Use generic names. - Figures: Figure-10 does not represent any vascular structure for any reader, please mark with arrows, etc in order to show the lesion (also valid for other figures). - Discussion: Please revise 'commoner' with 'more common' - Discussion: Do the authors think that embolization techniques (reference 13) are applicable in such ICA-IJV fistula, or not?
