The manuscript could be significant for the scientific community. In a search on the topic I could not find many article with tomato paste and bakery items. Functional foods are very important currently and this could add to the body of literature.</p> <p>2. Yes, the title is suitable.</p> <p>3. The abstract is sufficient. The last two sentences are new thoughts and not addressed in the manuscript.</p> <p>4. The subsections are appropriate, yet they do not address the topic in depth enough for a Review article. Examples to follow.</p> <p>5. The manuscript is scientifically correct.</p> <p>6. The references are old- most recent is 2016, which is not considered current. One reference was from 1958- so the information presented from that source was very outdated. I believe more references and more current ones would improve this article.</p> <p>7. Extra thoughts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Section 2- preparation of tomato powder: This looks like what the researchers did to dry tomato products since there are no sources to support the process. In a review article, it should cover all the options for process. In a quick search I found five other ways to dry tomato products (vacuum foam, solar dried, vacuum belt, window drying and foam mat drying). • Section 3 could use a source to tell what losses there are when a product is baked. • Conclusion: You introduce new information instead of summing your findings. You didn't discuss infant nutrition or shelf life, but put them in the conclusion. 	
<p>Minor REVISION comments</p> <p>1. Is language/English quality of the article suitable for scholarly communications?</p>	<p>1. Grammar needs minor repairs. Some sentences need capital letters, some extra words that aren't necessary, and everything in a section isn't always a single paragraph. You do have some sentences that do not make sense. Under 2.; the first sentence is awkward and isn't clear in it's meaning. You don't say "in cookies are"; the "in" isn't necessary. You use this type of phrase many times.</p>
