The introduction would remain incomplete without few more clarification regarding casue of GA among elders. c) The article is a literature review. But the title resembled more or less findings from meta analysis. A meta analysis demands tables of the analysis. Please include tables. d) What is the importance and significance of including two reviewers for this study, is not clear. e) Data were not summarized rounding the number of reviewers and the classification of GA. f) There is lack of clarification on whether the GA is a disease or symptom while treating the GA.</p>
