The study used for analyzing the impact of oil wealth on economic growth in Nigeria is based on regression analysis. Regression equations of real gross domestic product to control other development indicators such as agriculture, education, health, and oil revenue from 1990 to 2021. The study concluded that the government should implement measures to promote active private-sector involvement in the nation's crude oil sector. Based on the analysis, it can be concluded that oil revenue has a positive and significant effect on economic growth in Nigeria, as expected. However, the effect is relatively small and depends on other factors such as education, agriculture, and health. Education and agriculture have a significant positive effect on economic growth, while the effect of health on economic growth is not significant. Based on these findings, it is recommended that the Nigerian government should diversify its economy away from reliance on oil revenue and focus on developing other sectors such as agriculture and education. The title of the article is suitable. In the abstract of this article no main aim. The experiments are well conducted, and the purpose of this study seems to be clear. The manuscript is scientifically correct, but no Adam Smith and Adam Smith (p.3) The references are very short and will be better with more actual works.
