In the paper, the author clearly shows the impact of language orientation to language attitudes and active language learning.</p> <p>Yes. <u>However, consider deleting the article "the" preceding the noun, Learners.</u></p> <p><u>Yes. But it can be improved on by providing information on how data analysis was done.</u></p> <p><u>Yes. Provide a section for recommendations</u></p> <p><u>Yes. Scientific process of enquiry and methodology has been clearly elaborated.</u></p> <p><u>Yes. Majority of the reference books date between 2020-2023. The only dated reference is a classic on attitudes.</u></p> <p><u>The author could do well to provide an in-depth discussion of results, citing examples of what obtains elsewhere, and/comparing with what was discovered in this study.</u></p>	
<p><b>Minor</b> REVISION comments</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Is language/English quality of the article suitable for scholarly communications?</li> </ol>	<p><u>The paper is well structured but has a lot of grammatical issues to be dealt with. This include but are not limited to: improper use of verb tenses e.g. pg. 5, use of inappropriate verbs, pg. 6, repetition, pg 6-7. Besides, the author should restructure the sentences so as to use a combination of simple, compound and complex sentences. Left as is, the sentences are too long, a consequence of which they impact comprehension and distort the flow of ideas. It is recommended that the author uses a spell checker or hires the service of an editor to clear up numerous editorial issues. These however, DO NOT impact the substance of the paper.</u></p> <p>More guidance is provided within the manuscript as presented for the author.</p>
