On bases of one single case this conclusion cannot be drawn.</p> <p>No. Seventh line abstract reframe as. " We report a case of 43 year women treated for breast cancer with docetaxel and developed T-CME. She was treated with two cycles of Docetaxel 150 mg, Pertuzumab 420 mg and Trastuzumab 360mg. Three days after 2nd cycle she complained of diminution of vision. Her both eye visual acuity was 20/200. Fundus examination showed macular edema which was confirmed with SD-OCT and fluorescein angiography. After forth cycle Docetaxel was stopped by treating physician. Reframe the last sentence of Introduction as "We report here an interesting case of bilateral CME caused by docetaxel occurring within one month after starting the drug with cumulative dose of 300mg 2. Reframe the 1st Paragraph of case report as "Patient came with complaint of diminution of vision in both eyes since.... days. She was known case of breast cancer on chemotherapy. She had received two cycles of Docetaxel 150 mg, Pertuzumab 420 mg and Trastuzumab 360mg. Three days after her 2nd cycle(please make sure 2nd or 3rd..Previously u have mentioned 3rd cycle) she experienced diminution of vision. She did not had any comorbidities such as diabetes, hypertension, ocular or systemic inflammatory diseases." 3. Fourth and fifth paragraph of case report please reframe. "Hence, we diagnosed her as Docetaxel induced CME and notified her treating physician. However, she received her fourth cycle of chemotherapy as routine. After forth cycle Docetaxel was stopped by treating physician. Rest of chemotherapeutic cycles included only Pertuzumab and Trastuzumab."

Remove “as they should be”.6. Multiple Grammer mistakes are present in manuscript. We suggest you to run your manuscript through Grammarly7. Reframe Conclusion as: “T-CME is a rare complication caused by docetaxel. In most cases T-CME is self-resolving after stopping the drug. It can be associated with a low dose of Docetaxel than reported in literature. We suggest further studies which may help us to find the answer.”8. Write the references in Vancouver scale.
