If you have suggestion of additional references, please mention in the review form. <p><u>(Apart from above mentioned 6 points, reviewers are free to provide additional suggestions/comments)</u></p>	<p>In the manuscript, the topic of paronychia as a specific entity in clinical medicine was summarized, which can be useful as a reminder or instructive literature for clinicians (general practitioners or specialists in Dermatology or other relevant clinical specializations.</p> <p>Instead of proposed text of the Title, I suggest the following corrections: "Paronychia, Its diagnosis and current potential treatment-based management: brief schematic review"</p> <p>Yes; however, it should be stylistically remade in the spirit of the English language</p> <p>I suggest to authors to systematize more the overall text, to avoid repetition (causes of acute vs chronic paronychia etc); instead of the existing order of the subsections, after the Introduction section I suggest to the authors to start with Etiology, Patophysiology, then Anamnestic data and clinical presentation, Diagnosis, and, at the end, section Therapy: a) General procedures and prevention; b) Medicament therapy c) Surgical therapy. Topics of acute and chronic paronychia may be presented together, or separately with the same titles of subsections, but the most important correction is to make better systematisation of the topic, as there are too much repetitions.</p> <p>Yes</p> <p>Yes</p> <p>I suggest to authors to add some more focus on some aspects of chronic paronychia in Patophysiology section - diabetes (microvascular and macrovascular complications etc), pathogenesis of chronic inflammation in contact dermatitis and eczema; and to include separate subsection Complications (i.e. infectious flexor tenosynovitis)</p> <p>Regarding pictures, the number of the picture should be indicated in parentheses in the text that refers to them</p> <p>Instead of the Figure 3, I suggest to add a Table that would have all mentioned causes of paronychia, categorized in the Acute causes and Chronic causes. I believe that this would improve the quality of the article.</p> <p>The abbreviations should be explained before using them in the text.</p> <p>The photographs of the patients are used in the manuscript, so it should be emphasized (in section Etical statement) that photographs are published with the consent of the patient, following General Data Protection Regulation.</p>
