This research adopted a survey design approach, considered particularly to focus on small-scale fashion designers in the Ashanti region of Ghana. The data was collected from a survey of 398 small-scale fashion designers in Ghana through Drawing upon Human Capital Theory (HCT), The author employed a Partial Least Squares Structural Equation Modelling (PLS-SEM) to examine the relationships between formal education, business size, and business performance.</p> <p>The important findings indicate a significant positive relationship between formal education and business performance, suggesting that education plays a pivotal function in enhancing the performance of small-scale fashion designers. However, the study did not discover a significant relationship between formal education and business size, suggesting other factors, such as access to capital and market opportunities, may be critical for business expansion. This study was conducted in Ghana, a Sub-Saharan African country. While this provided valuable insights into the dynamics within an emerging economy, it also restricts the generalizability of the findings</p> <p>The Overall status of this study is very good .
