The study demonstrated that falciparum malaria and urinary schistosomiasis co-infection is associated to the health area investigated and participants' visit to nearby streams. Control efforts in such areas should focus on sensitization and provision of potable water.2. In the past, the Tiko Health District was not included in the national annual treatment of school age children against schistosomiasis. This study confirms Tiko Health District as a focus of schistosomiasis in the South West Region of Cameroon. The results of this study may provide the evidence needed to include the health district in the national control programme.3. Communities in the health district may benefit from annual treatment of pre-school age and school age children against schistosomiasis.
