The article is an impressive research article. The article is well-written, most interesting and important. The authors' main conclusions make good common sense to me.

Meanwhile, in this study, income inequality is found in each district/city in the province of Bali. According to BPS data, over the past three years, the gap in per capita income in Bali has been quite high. In 2019, Bangli Regency had the lowest per capita income, which was Rp. 30,722.11, while Badung Regency had the highest per capita income, which was Rp. 92,561.50. This continues to happen; similarly, in 2020, Bangli Regency received the lowest income per capita, IDR 26,036.28, while Badung Regency had the highest income per capita, IDR 89,290.46.
