The article is enlightening and interesting for the scientific community, especially in areas where tuberculosis is endemic. In disadvantaged areas of the world, chronic tuberculosis infection remains a significant concern. Clinicians in these endemic regions may find it challenging to differentiate patients presenting with systemic common symptoms in their daily practice. 2. Yes, the title was found to be appropriate for the article. However, the following title may be considered as an additional suggestion: Insights into Gastric Tuberculosis: A Case Study of Immunocompetent Patients 3. The summary of the article was found to be quite comprehensive and explanatory. It encapsulates the important points discussed within the article. 4. Yes, the sections and structure of the article seem appropriate. 5. I believe the article is scientifically accurate because gastric ulcers and folds are clearly visible in the endoscopy images. Additionally, stomach wall thickening and surrounding lymphadenopathies are clearly evident in the tomography image. 6. When reviewing the literature on gastric tuberculosis and examining the publications I encounter, I find that the references provided are generally up-to-date. However, there are a few instances where additional references need to be added: after the sentence of "even in regions where intestinal tuberculosis is prevalent, accounting for 0.5 to 3% of gastrointestinal tuberculosis cases." After the sentence of: "When gastric tuberculosis leads to pyloric obstruction, nausea and vomiting become prominent symptoms, with exacerbation typically observed in the afternoon and evening."
