Such research is essential to highlighting both the benefits and potential drawbacks of AI's role in educational settings.</li> <li>The title of the manuscript is suitable for the content it presents.</li> <li>The abstract would benefit from including the significance or implications of the research findings. This addition would provide a clearer understanding of the study's impact and relevance.</li> <li>The structure of the manuscript is correct, but the way of narration is a bit digressive, which loses the logical flow. The limitations and Implications of the study can be relocated. I suggest placing them under the Conclusion subsection. Furthermore, the conclusion is the most important part as it covers the final decision about the research findings. The author just paraphrased some lines that s/he referred to in the introduction. Though the conclusion is a revisit of the introduction, the author should mention some key points of findings and how they will contribute to the academic literature. In the method section, the author mentioned an open-ended survey for interviews. The word survey may cause confusion for the readers. It might be open-ended questions, not surveys.</li> <li>The research lacks specific research questions. As a result, the findings do not strongly connect to how AI usage affects academic integrity and enhances learning outcomes, which are the main focuses of the research. The findings section does not adequately address these key areas. The discussion section seems to overlook the primary aim of the research. Although the author attempts to provide a comprehensive overview of AI in academia, it is crucial that the research questions, findings, and discussion are interwoven to ensure the research is scientific and valid. The author should revisit these sections to ensure they align more closely with the research aims.</li> <li>The references are recent (within the last five years) and highly relevant. There are many valuable articles available in Springer Nature that the author could utilize if needed.</li> </ol>	
<p><b>Minor</b> REVISION comments</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Is language/English quality of the article suitable for scholarly communications?</b></li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The overall language communication quality is acceptable but requires some corrections. Specifically, there are inconsistencies in tense usage, particularly in the method section, that need to be addressed.</li> </ol>

Statements are more generalized, though the author should have been more specific by providing examples while narrating the pros and cons of AI. Most of the sentences are just descriptive. It would be better if the presentation was analytical, like the Socratic approach. Adding the DOI number of each reference could be better.</p>
