Is language/English quality of the article suitable for scholarly communications?</p>	<p>The article's language quality is generally suitable for scholarly communication. However, there are instances where the phrasing is awkward, and the sentence structure could be improved for better readability. For example, the abstract could be more concise, avoiding repetition of the term 'Artificial Intelligence' and using acronyms after the first introduction. In the main text, transitions between sections should be smoother, and technical terms should be clearly defined to be accessible to a wider academic audience. Consistency in the use of terms (e.g., AI vs. Ai, which appears inconsistently throughout the text) should be addressed. Attention to punctuation, especially the use of commas to separate clauses, would improve the overall flow of the text. Professional proofreading is recommended to refine these aspects.</p>
