A good example is "This study will explore students' risk communication effectiveness and how it helps them prepare for an earthquake. This study will be the basis of conducting the research, and this will guide how they manage themselves when earthquakes occur". There are several examples. The acceptable tense should be past tense. Some sentences are too long and need to be separated into tow or even three. An example of this type is:" However, the result also showed that the emergency needs of the College of Teacher Education students are high, which means that most of the students were able to prepare the necessary things such as first aid kit, drinking water, go bag, or can goods before and after the earthquake, even though most of the time they do not prepare some of it, for the reason that there are things that the students are not prepared for because there are things or materials that they do not have".
