The literature review section contains short paragraphs that must contain headings and subheadings to properly discuss the comparison between Muslim and non-Muslim countries. With this research, the methodology does not contain any criteria that have been set to take the data of the countries as well as the keywords based on which the data have been collected. 5. The manuscript based scientifically is not properly managed as the researcher has not divided it into headings and subheadings. With this, it does not discuss any criteria set for the data collection and the specific countries' data. 6. Revisit the references and include all references in the list that have been used in the research that are very old. Replace the references of the study with the recent articles.
