The manuscript is highly relevant and important for the scientific community. This case report addresses a significant intersection between chronic alcoholism and Parkinson's disease (PD), two conditions that are independently well-documented but not frequently studied together. The unique presentation of early-onset PD in a patient with a long history of alcohol abuse offers valuable insights into the potential contributory role of chronic alcohol consumption in the pathogenesis of PD. Additionally, the manuscript emphasizes the need for a multidisciplinary approach to manage such complex cases, highlighting both motor and non-motor symptoms, and the importance of addressing comorbid conditions like alcohol use disorder in the therapeutic regimen. The findings could stimulate further research into the mechanisms linking alcohol abuse and PD, potentially leading to improved diagnostic and therapeutic strategies.</p> <p>2. The title is clear and directly reflects the content of the manuscript. It effectively conveys the focus of the case report, which is the occurrence of Parkinson's disease in an individual with a history of chronic alcoholism. Alternative title could be: "Early-Onset Parkinson's Disease in a Chronic Alcoholic: A Case Study Highlighting the Need for Multidisciplinary Care". This alternative title emphasizes the early onset of Parkinson's disease and the importance of a comprehensive treatment approach, adding more specificity to the context of the case.</p> <p>3. The abstract is comprehensive, providing a clear overview of the case report. It succinctly outlines the background of Parkinson's disease, the patient's history of chronic alcoholism, and the clinical presentation. Additionally, it highlights the diagnostic process, treatment approach, and the significance of a multidisciplinary strategy for managing such cases. The abstract effectively encapsulates the essential details, making it informative and complete for the readers.</p> <p>4. The subsections and structure of the manuscript are appropriate. The manuscript follows a logical flow, beginning with an introduction that provides background information on Parkinson's disease and chronic alcoholism. This is followed by the case report, which details the patient's history, symptoms, and clinical findings. The discussion section effectively analyzes the implications of the case, and the conclusion succinctly summarizes the key points. This clear and organized structure enhances the readability and comprehensibility of the manuscript.</p> <p>5. The manuscript appears to be correct. It provides a well-documented case with clear clinical findings and appropriate diagnostic methods. The treatment plan is consistent with current medical guidelines for managing Parkinson's disease, and the discussion accurately reflects existing</p>

However, to strengthen the manuscript further, it could benefit from including additional recent studies on the link between chronic alcoholism and Parkinson's disease, as well as more up-to-date research on the treatment and management of Parkinson's disease (e.g., Shao C, Wang X, Wang P, Tang H, He J, Wu N. Parkinson's Disease Risk and Alcohol Intake: A Systematic Review and Dose-Response Meta-Analysis of Prospective Studies. Front Nutr. 2021 Oct 14;8:709846. doi: 10.3389/fnut.2021.709846.).</p>
