The second thing is inflammation actually is, simply put, the excess of heat. So, to make the article more precise, temperature (hot/cold receptors) has to be put into discussion.</p> <p>Yes, references are very comprehensive and up to date.</p> <p>While in science, some TCM herbs are beneficial to be used... but we have to add into consideration of hot/cold receptivity as RA patients have aversion to heat/hotness... for example, if that TCM herbs will lead to hotness, then this has to be reconsidered.</p>
