The title of the article is short, suitable and to-the-point. The abstract has been written in a comprehensive manner. The structure and subsections of manuscript are appropriate. The manuscript is scientifically correct. The references are sufficient and recent.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are grammatical mistakes to be corrected in the abstract, discussion and conclusion parts. Suggest you mention the incidence rate of inferior shoulder dislocation instead of saying it is uncommon. The pre-reduction AP X-ray images could have been better or maybe a proper windowing could have helped. Images appear very blurry with artefacts. The post-reduction X-rays are comparatively better in the shoulder anatomy depiction. In the discussion portion, I advise you to elaborate on the radiographic features in inferior shoulder dislocation and how it can be differentiated from inferior dislocation mimics like sub-glenoid anterior dislocation. Also elaborate on the role of CT and post reduction MRI for diagnosis of secondary osseous, soft tissue, vascular, neurological, tendon, and ligament injuries. There is no mention of type of complications of inferior shoulder dislocation. The references should be according to the journal protocol.
