Is language/English quality of the article suitable for scholarly communications?</p>	<p>Yes, a few spelling mistakes noted are mentioned here- Promethasine Misdiagonsis Nigrostratum syntoms</p> <p>Consider rephrasing the following sentence- "Initially, the patient was diagnosed with severe malaria with meningitis as a differential diagnosis."</p>	
<p>Optional/General comments</p>	<p>1. As mentioned in the Introduction, the diagnosis of medication-induced acute dystonic reaction is clinical. It should also be a diagnosis of exclusion. Child presents with fever, vomiting and involuntary movements of acute onset. All possible differential diagnoses should have been ruled out prior to reaching this diagnosis.</p> <p>3. There is mention of antiepileptic medication being infused on hospital visit. How can we exclude the effect of AED in reducing the dystonic movements in this scenario?</p> <p>4. Getting an EEG done would have been objective and definitive in ruling out seizures.</p> <p>5. What happened to fever and vomiting after treatment? Please mention steps taken to resolve symptoms apart from dystonic movements.</p> <p>6. The fever being substantiated as part of neuroleptic malignant syndrome (even as a DD) is unlikely in this scenario.</p> <p>7. Describe the duration of in-patient hospital stay in terms of other medications and supportive care that the patient received.</p>
