Abstract is comprehensive with few corrected language mistakes in the manuscript.</p> <p>Subsections and structure of the manuscript are appropriate.</p> <p>I think, it is correct.</p> <p>The references are sufficient but mostly not recent and some are very old. However, this is predicted as lactulose causing lipoid pneumonia is not a known issue.</p> <p>As I mentioned in the corrections of the manuscript, please be sure of the case history if she received lactulose alone or also liquid paraffin and change the title and conclusion accordingly. Also, don't consider in your discussion that lactulose is a kerosene oil as it is not. Lactulose is a sugar derived from milk sugar and not even an oil.</p>
