However, the paper is not able to underscore issues specific to the context of nursing practice. Do nurses have the competency to mitigate and manage HAIs? It indicates general issues on HAIs. I did not see any gaps that the outcomes of this study could address.</p>

Please write your suggestions here.</b></p>	<p>Abstract must be in structured format to ensure that all essential information of an abstract are conveyed to the readers. Subsections of Abstract are: background of the study, objective, methods, results and brief discussion, conclusion, and key words.</p>	
<p><b>Are subsections and structure of the manuscript appropriate?</b></p>	<p><b>NO</b></p> <p>The necessary elements of a narrative review were not observed in this study. The process of review must have logically organized structure and discussed in the manuscript before the actual textual review. The common structure for narrative literature reviews is IMRaD, which was not applied. In <b>Introduction</b>, state not just the general objective, but as well as the specific objectives. In <b>Method</b> section, describe step by step how the study was performed. State the research design by specifying the type of narrative literature review you utilized in the paper. What search terms did you use to look for the literature? Where did you look? Were they findings of literature retrieved from searches of computerized databases, hand searches, and authoritative texts? Will you limit on research articles or include other published sources such as books, case reports, etc.? What is the scope of review as to inclusion and exclusion criteria of relevant literature? In <b>Results</b>, specify the key concepts and new findings. Underscore the outcomes to attaining the study objectives. Results and major concepts are evaluated, synthesized, and interpreted in the <b>Discussion</b>. Discuss the implications of the review results in healthcare practice and healthcare delivery system. Connect the major concepts to research potential. Provide <b>Conclusions</b> from the evidences describe and synthesize from the available literature on the topic understudied.</p>

Author(s) are generally not aware of the methodology, selections criteria and processes of conducting narrative literature review. Overall, the paper does not provide a wide-ranging perspective of the author(s). The review is not a comprehensive, critical, and objective analysis of the topic. The Introduction and Literature Review sections lack coherence and are mixed up. "Performance of nurses" must be operationally defined. Clarify the concepts of "care" and "infection control measures" in the specific objectives. Keep the foci of the study clear and defined. Indicate not just the trends, issues, and objectives (must be general and specific) state as well the GAPS that your study could address. Discuss the potential contributions of your review to practice, policy, research, and theory.</p>	
<p><b>Are the references sufficient and recent? If you have suggestions of additional references, please mention them in the review form.</b></p> <p>=</p>	<p>References are recent but not sufficient to come up with a comprehensive review. Having only 26 in the Reference list indicates that the narrative review was not comprehensive and holistic. References must focus more on nursing journals since the review involves nurses and the nursing practice.</p>
