Incorporating recent studies post-2020 will strengthen the paper's relevance, especially considering new treatments like SGLT2 inhibitors in heart failure care. 2. Address Emerging Technologies: To reflect advances in telehealth and digital health tools, the paper could include references on recent studies showing the effectiveness of remote monitoring and telehealth in managing heart failure patients. This is particularly relevant in the context of limited resource access.

<p>Minor REVISION comments</p> <p>Is the language/English quality of the article suitable for scholarly communications?</p>	<p>The language and English quality of the article are generally suitable for scholarly communication, but there are a few areas that could be improved for greater clarity and precision. The manuscript is well-structured, but some sentences could be rephrased to improve readability and fluency.</p> <p>Minor Revision Suggestions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Clarity and Precision: In certain sections, sentences can be reworded to enhance clarity. For instance, instead of saying "Medications are prescribed to address the underlying causes, relieve symptoms, and improve cardiac function," it could be rephrased as "Medications target underlying pathophysiological mechanisms, alleviate symptoms, and improve heart function." Consistency in Terminology: Ensure consistent use of terminology throughout the manuscript. For example, the use of terms like "heart failure," "HF," and "chronic condition" should be uniform for smoother reading. Avoiding Repetition: Some ideas, such as patient education and medication management, are repeated across sections. Streamlining these discussions to avoid redundancy can improve flow and focus.

The content focuses on a review of nursing interventions for heart failure management, which involves synthesizing existing literature and best practices in clinical care.</p> <p>As long as the cited studies were conducted ethically and follow proper standards, the review itself adheres to accepted ethical norms in scholarly communication.</p> <p>There do not appear to be any competing interest issues in this manuscript.
