The Author/authors can add these "According to Kabir et al., (2018), women were purposely chosen for low pay to exploit them in factories. Women are viewed as a docile obedient workforce that will take low earnings without demanding labor and human rights. Patriarchal societal norms have made it difficult for rural Bangladeshi women who were hired by RMG factories to participate in collective bargaining (Dhar,2024). Dhar (2021) noted globalization's effect on women's empowerment in Bangladesh. From an economic perspective, globalization has heightened employment opportunities for women but admitted differentiation in favor of male workers, persecution of women in unpaid or informal labor, ill-treatment of women in low-wage piece-rate workers, and poverty through the usual sources of income. Socio-culturally, globalization influences different groups of women in separate ways to create new properties for the execution of women and supports women's groups. Women are used the wrong way in international marketing of sex trafficking, tourist enjoyment, and other unethical exercises.
