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| <p>Isthe language/English quality of the articles suitable for scholarly communications?</p> | <p>The language and English quality of the article reveal both strengths and weaknesses that significantly impact its suitability for scholarly communication.</p> <p>Strengths include the use of appropriate technical terminology related to nursing care, healthcare delivery, and indigenous studies, which is crucial for engaging in scholarly discourse within these fields. Additionally, the article follows a clear structure, comprising sections such as Abstract, Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion, and Conclusion, which aids in comprehension and is characteristic of scholarly writing. The inclusion of statistical analyses, such as mean percentages and t-tests, further demonstrates a quantitative approach that is highly valued in academic research.</p> <p>However, there are notable weaknesses that detract from its effectiveness. Some sentences are overly complex or poorly structured, hindering understanding; for instance, the phrase "the factors to be considered if patients will submit to hospitalization or not, is determined by the quality patient health care" could be simplified for clarity. Furthermore, grammatical errors and awkward phrasings are present throughout the text, such as "the study aims to gauge," which should be revised to "the study aims to gauge." Repetitive language also appears, with certain concepts reiterated without adding new insights, leading to redundancy. Inconsistent terminology, such as the interchangeable use of "barangay" and "community," can confuse readers, while abrupt transitions between sections disrupt the overall flow of the narrative.</p> <p>To enhance the article's quality, several recommendations can be made: first, a thorough editing process focusing on sentence structure, grammar, and clarity is essential to improve readability. Second, ensuring consistent use of terms and definitions throughout the article will help avoid confusion. Third, streamlining content by consolidating similar points will ensure that each section contributes uniquely to the overall argument. Finally, improving transitions between sections will enhance the article's flow, guiding readers more smoothly through the argument.</p> | |

Expanding the literature review to include recent studies will strengthen the theoretical framework. The manuscript should also discuss the implications of the findings for nursing practice and healthcare policy, emphasizing their relevance to indigenous populations.
