<b>Optional/General</b> comments	<p>This study has several limitations. First, the higher participation of individuals already interested in environmental sustainability may have introduced selection bias, affecting the representativeness of the sample. Additionally, the survey's length (15-20 minutes) and its timing during the COVID-19 pandemic likely contributed to a smaller sample size than ideal, limiting statistical power. The findings are also based on a single health service in Queensland, which may not be generalizable to other regions, particularly rural and remote areas with distinct challenges. Furthermore, the cross-sectional design of the study prevents establishing causal relationships, and longitudinal studies would be valuable for understanding long-term trends and effective health system transitions.</p> <p>Hospitals that actively promote sustainability, such as by reducing single-use plastics or employing renewable energy, often foster greater employee engagement in green initiatives. Moreover, framing sustainability as an ethical responsibility, aligned with the Hippocratic Oath to "do no harm," can further strengthen positive attitudes among healthcare workers and students.</p>
