1) The introduction clarifies the nature of the studied problem.

2) About the part "Methodology":

The studied population is well described.

The used questionnaires and statistical methods are relevant to the design of the study.

3) Section "Results" – the text and tables reveal all findings about the studied problem.

4) In Discussion the authors compared their results with other studies upon the problem. The specificity of the discussed problem is well described. An important conclusion is derived from the results of study and deserves attention: "This study shows that the students are willing and ready to acquire the necessary skills, hence, there is a need to incorporate the training of basic first aid skills and basic life support skills in the school's curriculum to bridge the gap and increase the number of first responders in the country."

5) The references (80% from last five years) are listed in order of mentioning in the text and are cited correctly.
