I read the article entitled " Educational intervention to improve the knowledge, attitude, practices of health care professionals and students regarding the pharmacovigilance in tertiary care hospitals".

Unfortunately, it is a poorly organized article according to the rules of scientific writing. I think that it cannot be accepted unless the revisions I have mentioned below are made.

- There are many spelling and grammatical errors in the article.
- The points highlighted by the reviewers have not been revised.
- In the Discussion section, data not included in the Results are presented and discussed.
- The authors should reformat the abstract and the main text according to the journal's guidelines.
- The authors can combine Tables 1 and 2.
- The data presented in the table should not be repeated in the text.
- Reference numbered three cannot be reached. The authors had already accessed it five years ago!

References dating back 30 years should be updated (in the Introduction: Most cases of morbidity and mortality in people are due to ADRs. In the year 1994, cost of treatment to ADRs was 4billion dollars. In the year 1989 number of deaths was 12000 due to ADRs, it was reported by FDA).
