

**Editor's Comment:**

I am sorry but this article is not well written nor the citations accurate since the authors have just used references from another article as is without a knowledge of how to even cite that copied reference.

Example: The article from this webpage

[https://www.who.int/reproductivehealth/publications/maternal\\_perinatal\\_health/emergency\\_preparedness\\_antenatal\\_care.pdf](https://www.who.int/reproductivehealth/publications/maternal_perinatal_health/emergency_preparedness_antenatal_care.pdf)

has the same references (please see references 1 and 2 in the pdf document) for 4 and 5 in the manuscript and specified in the same way - including the year of access - which reveals that the authors have just taken those two references "as is".

Further the conclusions in the abstract do not read like that of a 'scientific article' with just one statement as the conclusion of a research study. Besides these two there are several sentence structuring and formatting issues and such which needs to be addressed.

A complete revision is required since the topic is a good one to investigate and report for sure.
