

Editor's Comment:

Definitely a step in the right direction but the references section still fraught with improper formatting and likely copying "as is". For example both references 1 and 2 (they supposedly downloaded one in 2005 and the second in 2020) have Baltimore, MD as the authors name !! Baltimore is a city in Maryland which is abbreviated as MD. References below with Jesmin Pervid still has the "superscript" symbol from wherever they copied as is - such superscripts as you know typically refer to footnotes or author's affiliation. I would like a plagiarism check done on the whole article to ensure that what we publish is in fact the authors contribution with due diligence paid to other authors whose findings or conclusions are properly cited.

At this point I would suggest a complete revision of the References section is required since I am not sure how much of it is the authors own contribution and not copied as is - it is possible they referred to the same articles but if so cite them appropriately. I would like to see that done in the revised copy.
