It did not capture the objectives of the study in clear terms. Findings, and a robust conclusion that reflect the study's objective is conspicuously absent. Recommendations based on findings are needed in the abstract.</b></p> <p><b>Second, the author should focus more on how the political gladiators in Nigeria in one of the Republics, and/or 4 or 8 years period of a Nigerian past president to make the study realise its objectives with precision. In other words, the topic is too broad.</b></p> <p><b>Third, the author, should own his/her work. Citation of other scholars' allusions in the work, and not adding any contribution to knowledge does not add up in research. Here, the author need to cite few instances where politicians used Broadcast media reportage to either make or mar their opponent's political ambitions , and its implications to the ; social economic and political development within the scope of the study in Nigeria.</b></p> <p><b>Again, the topic is about how politicians conduct their political activities within the confines of the electronic media, and NOT on the relevance of Broadcast Journalism. Many of them had negatively carried out political campaigns of: Calumny, blackmail, character assassination, libel via electronic media in which by extension, had hit up the polity. And, if the political system is not stable, insecurity looms, and no economic development will be recorded. Cases of such are common in Nigeria; cite and analysis them in a logical manner.</b></p> <p><b>Fourth, the author should tell the readers of study the actual beneficiaries of his/her findings and recommendations. Is it the politicians, students of political science, Journalists or who?</b></p>
