Compulsory REVISION comments	The discussion should not be limited to personal, behavioural and social factors . The author should look at the epidemiological and the health system factors . If the epidemic is too serious and there are many people infected and died, the need for vaccination will be overwhelmed. If the vaccination services are easy to access, more people will be willing to receive the services. On the opposite, if the vaccination services are too costly or difficult to get (too long queue, too difficult to reach vaccination sites) less people will be happy to get vaccination. Such factors, particularly the epidemiological one, are probably more influential than the personal and behavioural ones. Such discussion or some related background information on the epidemic and the health service system should be provided in the article.	
Minor REVISION comments	1. COVID-19 is an acronym. It is from "Coronavirus Infection 2019W. Thus, the correct word is "COVID-19" (all capital characters) and not "Covid-19". Since it is already an acronym, it should be inappropriate to shorten to C-19. 2. In the article, the character "V" may mean "vaccine", "vaccination", or "vaccinated". With such different representations, it should be more appropriate to use the full words.
