Authors should be careful when writing a manuscript.</p> <p>For patients with potentially malignant disease, there is no record of pharmacological treatment presented, please provide. (like cytostatic medication or corticosteroids)</p> <p>First sentence of discussion is incorrect! Most common malignancy is breast cancer. Please be careful when writing such a strong statement. If you wanted to emphasize about head and neck cancer, that it should be written as such.</p> <p>First sentence in Conclusions is not supported by the research of this study, nor the results of this study, to make such a conclusion it should be case control longitudinal study!</p> <p>Conclusion should be a concise answer to the aims and hypothesis of the study, not a discussion as it is in this manuscript. Please correct it. And please state your major findings as well as possible future research that will follow your results.</p>	
<b>Minor</b> REVISION comments	<p>The term "Potentially malignant oral disorders" should be marked in apostrophe.</p> <p>In materials and methods, when the abbreviation is first written, it has to come with whole words, followed by abbreviations in brackets.</p>
