Compulsory REVISION comments	This study examines the critical junctures of Nigeria exports. The authors showed that the SAP and other export strategies adopted by the Nigeria country has failed in promoting the exportations. As solution, they recommend that the authorities should act on the monetary and fiscal policies as well as the infrastructures development in order to improve exports.	
Minor REVISION comments	Regarding the work, the authors should look at the following comments: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - While the objective of the study is clear the authors did not state the research question. This should be done. - The citation of Chete et al (nd) at page 6 does not mention the year. What does nd stand for? - In the literature review, they must show the limit of the existing studies especially in the Nigeria context that will justify the interest of the current study. - At page 8 the authors should turn "the period 1981 -1975" into "1975 -1981" (see Decline in merchandize exports began from the period 1981 – 1975) - They should check the reference list for Ozili, P., & Arun, T (20220). Also, they used "and" in some references (see Collier, R.B and Collier, D (1991). Or Osuntogun A, Edordu, C.C, and Oramah, B.O (1997) for example). While the symbol "&" is commonly used. 	
Optional/General comments	While this study focusses on the export strategies for Nigeria, it might be interesting to compare the trade balance over the two sub-periods in order to know whether imports followed the same trend with exports especially in the periods where exports decreased. Also, the production and domestic demand will be useful in explaining the export capacities before and after the SAP.
