There are some statements that the economy of Bangladesh reflected the developing countries. It is bias in research, because every country has its own character and the unique things. And there is no clear definition about developing countries. Examples : Least developed countries, landlocked developing countries and small island developing states (see definition by World Bank). Suggestion : Revise these statement, just focus on Bangladesh as the object of research..</p>
