An ulcer has a margin, edge and floor and a base. The authors have described a border and a surface. There is a case presentation and a case report section which is confusing and a repetition. There are a lot of grammatical errors. Sentences are too long and mixes three or four diverse concepts. The sentence needs to be broken to smaller ones to make it more meaningful and readable. Discussion is a repetition.</p> <p>Photographs are good. Description of surgical treatment is acceptable Final result is excellent. Please spend some more time with the case writing and discussion and make this case report in a better format</p>
