Compulsory REVISION comments	<p>Impetigo is a common skin infection that mainly affects infants and young children, characterized by basic lesions of shallow, scattered bullae, which rapidly turn pus, burst, and form into crusts. The disease is usually caused by staphylococcus aureus, streptococcus, or a combination of both. It is very contagious and often spreads directly from infected skin to healthy skin on the same child, or from one child to another and therefore known as "contagious impetigo". The disease can cause topical and/or systemic complications if not detected and treated promptly.</p> <p>Epidemiological studies and updated treatment of impetigo are still being performed to better clarify the pathogenicity factors and update more effective methods to manage the disease.</p> <p>The review article on impetigo is urgent and scientifically valuable in Dermatology. However, the information in the article is not really up-to-dated. The content of the review is still fundamentally inadequate to be a true scientific paper.</p> <p>Information about antibiotics used topically and orally in the treatment of impetigo is relatively old and may be no longer true in the context of antibiotic-resistant bacteria increase due to the indiscriminate use of antibiotics. Some new information, if possible, should be included in the article by the author such as how to control the disease in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic, the current bacterial spectrum of impetigo, and disease prevention...</p> <p>The content of the article has many overlaps with other articles written about impetigo in 2014. Most of citations used are far more from the current, there are only 2 recent citations, one in 2021 and another in 2018. Paragraphs need to be rewritten: abstract, clinical presentation, diagnosis, management, prognosis, and complication.</p>	
Minor REVISION comments	<p>Categories in the overview article are presented clearly, easy to follow.</p> <p>We encourage to add more images to better clarify the content of the review, especially in the diagnosis and treatment regimen.</p>	
Optional/General comments	<p>The title of the review article has high scientific value and applicability. However, the content of the article still has many issues that need to be edited and considered in order to be published.</p>
